The College Session is divided into three sessions: 1—from the commencement of the session in October, to the Christmas recess; 2—from the Christmas to the Easter recess; 3—from the Easter recess to the close of the session in the middle of June. Each recess to be limited to a fortnight at the utmost. The first Matriculation Examination was held on 30th and 31st October, 1849. The several departments for public instruction opened on 7th November. Supplementary Matriculation Examinations were fixed for 13th Nov., 1849, and 8th Jan., 1850.

The matriculation or entrance for general students' course, consists of English Grammar and Composition; Homer's Iliad, Xenophon's Anabasis—the first three books of each; Walker's Lucian; Virgil's Æneid, the first six books; Horace, the first book of the Odes and of the Satires; all Sallust; Cæsar, the 5th and 6th books of the Gallic war; re-translation of Cæsar's Commentaries from English into Latin; Arithmetic, the first four rules, Fractions, vulgar and decimal, the square root; Algebra, to the end of Simple Equations; Euclid's Elements, the first two books; Grecian History, to the death of Alexander the Great; Roman History, to the accession of Augustus; Outlines of Grecian History. The entrance course for Engineering students is the same as the preceding, with the exclusion of the Greek and Latin Languages; that for Agricultural students is confined to English Grammar and Composition, and the Elements of Arithmetic. The examination for Literary scholarships of the first year consists of all the subjects of the entrance course, and also the Medea of Euripides, the 2nd book of Herodotus, Virgil's Georgics, the first two books of Horace's Odes and Epistles, and all his Satires; Cicero, De Senectute et Amicitia, re-translations of Cicero from English into Latin, and original Essays

The subjects of the matriculation or entrance examination for students in the Faculties of Arts, Medicine, and Law, are English Grammar and Composition; Homer's Iliad, the first four books; Xenophon's Anabasis—the first three books; Walker's Lucian; Virgil's Æneid, the first six books; Horace, the first book of the Odes and of the Satires; all Sallust; Cæsar, the fifth and sixth books of the Gallic war; re-translation of Cæsar's Commentaries from English into Latin; Arithmetic, the first four rules, Fractions, vulgar and decimal, the Square Root; Algebra, to the end of Simple Equations; Euclid's Elements, the first two books; Grecian History, to the death of Alexander the Great; Roman History, to the accession of Augustus; Outlines of Grecian History. The entrance course for Engineering and Agricultural students is the same as the preceding, with the exclusion of the Greek and Latin Languages.

The examination for Literary scholarships of the first year consists of all the subjects of the entrance course, and also the Medea of Euripides, the 2nd book of Herodotus, Virgil's Georgics, the first two books of Horace's Odes and Epistles, and all his Satires; Cicero de Senectute et Amicitia, re-translations of Cicero from English into Latin, and original Essays in English prose, on subjects given by the Examiner. The examination for Science scholarships of the first year, consists, in addition to the subjects of the entrance course, of Quadratic Equations, Permutations, Combinations, Logarithms; 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, and 6th books, the definitions of the 1st book of Euclid's Elements; and Plane Trigonometry. For Engineering students, the same as that for Science scholarships; and for Agricultural students, English Grammar and Composition; Arithmetic, to the end of Decimal Fractions; Involution, Evolution, Proportion, Simple Interest, Mensuration, Book-keeping, and Outlines of Modern Geography.

Thirty junior scholarships, of £24 each, are awarded in each of the Colleges; ten to undergraduate students of the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd years respectively, of the Faculty of Arts, exclusive of Civil Engineering and Agriculture; six junior scholarships of £20 each, to undergraduate students of the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd years respectively, of the Faculty of Medicine; three junior scholarships, of £20 each, to undergraduate students of the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd classes of the Faculty of Law. Two scholarships, of £20 each, are to be awarded to students of Civil Engineering; and four, of £15 each, to those of Agriculture, to be distributed in each case equally for the 1st and 2nd years. The thirty junior scholarships of Arts are to be divided into two classes, the Literary and the Scientific. Five of the ten junior scholarships of each year to be appropriated to each class, exclusive of Civil Engineering and Agriculture. All the junior scholarships are tenable for one year only; but the students of each year are not to be disqualified from becoming candidates for scholarships of the succeeding year in their several departments. The examinations for junior scholarships of the first year are to take place immediately after the matriculation or entrance examination, and to be open to all students who have passed that examination.

Ten senior scholarships, of £40 each, are to be awarded to students in the three faculties, in the following proportions, viz.:—seven to the most distinguished students who have proceeded to the degree of Bachelor of Arts, in Greek, Latin, and Ancient History; in Modern Languages and History; in Mathematics; in Natural Philosophy; in Metaphysical and Economical Science; in Chemistry, and in Natural History;—two to students who have completed the three years' course prescribed for candidates for the degree of Doctor of Medicine, viz., one for Anatomy and Physiology, and one for Therapeutics and Pathology;—one to the pupils who have proceeded to the degree of Bachelor of Arts, and have completed the course of legal studies prescribed for candidates for the degree of Bachelor of Law. The student first on the lists of candidates, both in the Literary and Science Divisions, at the examination for junior scholarships in Arts, shall be entitled to a scholarship in each division; but in no other case are two scholarships to be held by the same student.

QUARTER SESSIONS COURT.

Each Session commences on the Thursday next following the day on which the Dublin Quarter Sessions begin (for which see Calendar), and continues in effect for three months. The sitting days are every Friday throughout the year, except on festivals and during Assizes; and the Recorder is empowered by Statute to Preside as Judge, without other Justices. Cases of Petty Sessions, and all misdemeanors that occur within the Borough, are within the jurisdiction of this Court.

THE RECORD COURT

Of the Recorder of the Borough of Cork is held every Thursday throughout the year, except on festivals and during the Assizes. All personal actions that occur within the City and Liberties are within its jurisdiction, and the Recorder is constituted by Statute Judge of the Court. Under the New Act the Recorder has Civil Bill jurisdiction, same as Assistant Barrister for county, excepting in cases of Ejectment, in which jurisdiction only exists where the yearly rent does not exceed twenty pounds.—Court day for Civil Bills, Tuesday in every month.
